# PRI recommended for ISO certification

The Philippine Railways Institute (PRI) underwent its stage 2 certification audit and was recommended for ISO 9001 certification by auditors from its third-party certifying body, Certification International Philippines, Inc. (CIP), September 13.

After the two-day audit conducted by the CIP auditors on September 12-13, various conformities and opportunities for improvement were identified in the implementation of the PRI's established Quality Management System (QMS).

On the other hand, three (3) minor nonconformities (NCs) in the areas of internal quality audit, documented information, and gathering of customer's satisfaction were determined. These minor NCs, however, did not preclude the auditors from recommending the PRI for certification subject to the submission of an Action Plan as stated in the **Audit Report.** 

During the Closing Meeting, CIP auditors, Mr. Edgardo V. Eleria and Ms. Ermelinda P. Andres, congratulated the PRI for establishing and implementing its QMS. They also highlighted the strong commitment of the whole organization from the top management down to its personnel, which was evident during the audit.

The PRI established its QMS in September 2021 and underwent its stage 1 certification audit on July 28, 2022.



# 19 PRI instructors to attend specialized training in Japan

The instructors who will undergo the said training from October 03 to 01 December 2022 have different specializations such as Train Operations, Station Operations, Rolling Stock, Buildings and Facilities, Tracks and Guideways, Electrical and Machinery, and Railways Safety.

"The learning and knowledge that will be gained in the training in Japan are very important since the future railway lines are already in the pipeline and other potential lines across the country," Secretary Bautista reminded the instructors.

"Stick it out, stay with the Philippine Government", reminded by the Secretary as he encouraged the instructors to stay in the Government to ensure the quality of the conduct of training for the current and future railway personnel. "Mas mabuti na magkaroon ng railway system na makakarating hanggang Mindanao, para ma-develop pa ang ating economy," Secretary Bautista added.

The PRI training is pursuant to the Records of Discussion between the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and the DOTr to establish the PRI. The JICA was tasked to conduct training of trainers to support the PRI's operations. 🏋

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### CHED CONDUCTS CAPACITY **DEVELOPMENT FOR PRI**


Continuous learning - That is the call of both the Philippine Railways Institute and the Commission on Higher Education. Having almost the same mandate, a partnership was forged between the two agencies in October 2020 through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding that includes capacity building initiatives relative to the development of guidelines on the implementation of the Philippine Qualifications Framework and the Philippine Credit Transfer System.

Assisted by technical resource persons, a Joint PRI-CHED Working Group was established to achieve the leveling of skills and competencies for the different careers and opportunities in the railway sector. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the partnership was also silently working on the credit transfer system that will make certain courses be accredited prior to the PRI training.

The partnership's first workshop was held on September 28 at the UP University Hotel, Diliman, Quezon City. The workshop, which was participated by around 40 PRI staff, aimed to capacitate personnel on the harmonization and integration of PRI training courses with relevant CHED Engineering and **Technology Programs.** 

During the workshop, emphasis was placed on discussing the content and outcomes of the PRI training curricula for possible embedment into the existing engineering curricula and/or elective subjects in higher

### <u>199 trainees receive</u> PRI certificates

On 29 September 2022, the Philippine Railways Institute (PRI) conducted its 10th Graduation Ceremony to recognize 199 trainees who successfully completed either the PRI's Refresher Training (RT) Course and Fundamental Training (FT) Course.

The PRI Training Division Chief, Israel A. Radiaganding delivered his welcome message to all participants of the graduation ceremony. "The certificate you will receive is just a beginning in the development of the country's rail sector and you are an important part of it. All the learning you gained from the training will help the Philippine railway transportation in ensuring the safe, reliable, efficient, and comfortable railway transportation" Mr. Radiaganding said to the graduates.

On behalf of Secretary Jaime J. Bautista, DOTr Undersecretary and PRI Office-In-Charge Anneli R. Lontoc, delivered the keynote message and congratulated the graduates who attended the ceremony both in person and online. Usec. In the FT Course, three (3) DOTr-MRT3 new O&M personnel received their Certificates of Competency while 64 aspiring railway personnel received their Certificates of Appearance, which can be later on converted into Certificates of Competency upon their employment in the railway sector. The PR graduation ceremony was also attended by JICA Expert Team's Training Leader, Mr. Takahiro Tanisaka. The PRI will endorse the names of graduates of the FT Course to the existing railway operators and other service providers for potential employment. ## PRI's Manzano advocates for better mental health in the railway industry

To honor the yearly World Health Awareness Day, Ryan Christopher V. Manzano of the Institutional and Human Skills Section of the Philippine Railways Institute gave a talk on overthinking and limits and boundaries of anxiety during a recently concluded webinar, September 23.

Philippines (PUP) Railway Engineering Department, focused on raising awareness, specifically on students' mental health as a support to a new academic year and career paths. The said webinar, is part of their efforts to promote academic excellence, healthy exchange of emotions and knowledge, enhancement of social awareness, and camaraderie among Railway Engineering students.

Manzano, a licensed psychometrician and social worker, talked about the Signs of Overthinking, Types of Unproductive Overthinking, Reward of Overthinking, and Ways to Stop Overthinking. The PRI instructor further discussed that there are studies associating overthinking with depression, anxiety, and PTSD. "Significantly, a survey made by the British Rail Safety and Standards Board showed that rail employees experienced 1.5 times higher rates of anxiety compared with the general population, " stressed Manzano.

These remarkable statistics show that mental health is a significant issue in the railway industry worldwide. The COVID-19 pandemic has triggered a closer focus on the railway workforce and collective well-being. "We need to explore practical steps all of us can take to support each and everyone," Manzano pointed out.

The PUP alumnus ended by warning that individuals with poor mental health take a much higher degree of sickness, which in turn affects an organization's productivity. Along with him as resource speaker is Rachelle Ann G. Castro, a registered and licensed psychologist and psychometrician, who discussed how to overcome emotional stress and fear.

# **LunChat 3.0 promotes careers in railway**

20 September 2022 - The third session of the LunChat series was held tackling the overview of the last two remaining railway competencies - Fare and Ticketing Management (FTM) and Commercial Train Driving (CTD). Participants from across the country attended the short, informative webinar via Facebook Live while having their lunches in the comfort of their respective locations.

This initiative was derived from the cooperation and partnership of the Philippine Railways Institute and the Department of Education in promoting railway-related careers and opportunities to graduating Senior High School (SHS) students. Microsessions such as the LunChat series were proposed to tackle and introduce different railway competencies to the students. The first LunChat was held in March 2022, which discussed the Building and Facilities Maintenance and Passenger Management competencies. On the other hand, the LunChat 2.0 in June 2022 tackled the Tracks and Guideways Maintenance, Power Supply and Distribution Maintenance, and the Signaling and Communications Maintenance competencies.

In the most recent LunChat 3.0, SHS students coming from as far as South Cotabato and Leyte gained insights and asked questions regarding the FTM and CTD competencies. The FTM competency was discussed by Ms. Karen Bitao, an experienced ticket seller for more than 11 years in LRT Line 1 and now leads the PRI's training for the said competency. Meanwhile, the CTD competency was tackled by Engr. Darwin Discaya, a registered mechanical engineer and former MRT Line 3 train driver for 12 years.

The LunChat series aims to introduce and attract the youth and interested students to the wonders of the railway sector. Due to the sector's continuous growth, a huge demand is expected in the near future. The PRI then took the initiative through this series to ensure that the demand will be met as students consider joining the railway workforce by aligning their career paths Train of Thought: To What Station?, organized by the Polytechnic University of the prior to entering their undergraduate and technical-vocational programs.
